How can I tell if a page site is secure?

When you actually purchase item/items you should see:

 URL (site address) that starts with https:// instead of http:// --note: the "s" means your credit card and personal information is encrypted when transmitted on the internet.

- 2) Lock Icon --note: you will see a lock icon in the Security Status bar. The Security Status bar in IE 8 browser is located on the right side of the Address bar.
- Also helpful to have contact, shipping info as well as extra charges clear on the page before you buy the product.

Don't pay with Cash: If retailer does not accept credit cards, and wants money wired via Western Union or Money Gram , You should not buy.

Codes, Coupons, Rebates

Bensbargains.net: provides, coupons, codes and deals for free stuff.
Coupons are marked if they expired.

Couponcabin.com: merchandise and coupon codes for online shopping.

Couponnetwork.com: pintable coupons and dollars-off rewards to be used on future purchases. Require free registration.

Coupons.com: simply laid out and easy to use site. Good for specific items. Offers several printable coupons and recipes to go along with your savings. It is free to sign up.

Everydaysavingscenter.com: available to AARP members, offering savings on brands and services. eg. Land's End; Target and more than 500 retailers and manufacturers.

•<u>Smartsource.com</u>: very much like coupon.com, but some different coupons.

Codes, Coupons, Rebates (cont'd)

Promotional codes.com: feature thousands of coupons and promotional codes from the most popular merchants around.You can browse through various steals and deals, read descriptions of merchants, and even help fellow shoppers by uploading a coupon code of your own.

Rather-be-shopping.com: this site is updated daily with the best online coupons and bargains that we can find to most of your favorite stores.

Shoplocal.com: Offers printable coupons to all type of stores in your home town. You can also, shop online.



•<u>8Coupons.com</u>: provides deals from your neighborhood restaurants, bars, salons, and stores.

Eclipons: "DailyDeal" website that offers 50-90% off restaurants, retailers, and entertainment in the North and Northwest suburbs. Email registration required.

•GoldStar.com: discount ticket broker for theatre, comedy, sports, spa and other tickets in several metropolitan areas. Users must sign up for a free membership. There is a service charge for ticket purchases.

•Groupon.com: e-mails a daily deal per city offering. Once the deal has hooked a predetermined number of people, everyone who has opted in then "buys" the deal, and the marketer gets the money minus Groupon's cut 30%-50%. It only works if the deal reaches a set threshold.

•. <u>Livingsocial.com</u>: offers one deal everyday with discounts of up to 90% at local restaurants, bars spas, theaters and more.

 <u>ScoutMob.com/chicago</u>: brings access to local deals on restaurants, bars, and entertainment via email, iPhone, or Android.

Coupons Returns

CoupRecoup.com: is an online marketplace for unused promotions and deals. Users can purchase promotions that are no longer available for purchase, or they can sell off ones they bought but no longer need.

DealsGoRound.com: gives consumers a place to sell off those unwanted discounts and promotions. The user can upload their deal certificate to this website, where it is posted for sale. The user selling the certificate is paid via Paypal and the buyer is emailed the certificate.

<u>Lifesta.com</u>: created to give users a better way to get back some of the money spent on group coupons. Users can post their unused group coupons for sale. Others can seek out group coupons they may have missed.
