When young Zita discovers a device that opens a portal to another place, and her best friend is abducted, she is compelled to set out on a strange journey from star to star in order to get back home.


Legend of Old Salty | Matthew Loux








Better Nate Than Ever | Tim Federle




sisters arrive to a cold welcome as they discover that their mother, a dedicated poet and printer, is resentful of the intrusion of their visit and wants them to attend a nearby




The Books of Elsewhere | Jacqueline West
