


Reading a Web Address (URL)

A web address or URL (Universal Resource Locator) gives you clues about the webpage.




.edu – educational institutions
.gov – government organizations
.mil – military organizations
.org – organizations, usually non-profit

Internet Addresses vs. E-mail Address vs. Search Terms: There are Differences!

Internet address: sometimes called a URL or web address, this is the exact location of a webpage on the Internet. It should only be typed into the address box in the browser, not in the search box of a search engine. There are no spaces between words in an Internet address, and there is no "@" symbol. EXAMPLE: www.chicagotribune.com.

E-mail address: this is only used when you are sending an email to a person or organization. IT cannot be typed into the address box or the search box. There are no spaces between words in an e-mail address, and it always contains the "@" symbol. EXAMPLE: jsmith@aol.com

Search terms: sometimes called keywords, these are words or phrases typed only into the search box of a search engine (like Google). The words must be separated by spaces, and there is no "@" symbol. EXAMPLE: chocolate chip cookie recipes.

Search Engines

<u>Search engine</u> is a computer program that searches for specific words and returns a list of documents in which they were found, especially a commercial Internet service.

Glossary of Internet Terms

Bookmark: Netscape file that stores a user's favorite web sites for easier access.

Boot Up: To start a computer.

Browser: The computer program used to view web sites on the World Wide Web.

Netscape Navigator and Microsoft Internet Explorer are two popular

browsers.

Crash: When a program or operating system fails to respond or causes other

programs to malfunction.

E-mail: Electronic mail carried on the Net.

E-mail Address: Unique private Internet address to which your e-mail is sent. Takes the

form: user@host.

Download: Retrieve a file from a host computer. Upload means to send one the other

way.

Internet: A global system of interconnected computer networks. The World Wide

Web is one part of the Internet.

ISP: Internet Service Provider, a company that sells access to the internet.

Hacker: Someone who gets off on breaking through computer security and

limitations. A cracker is a criminal hacker.

Home Page: The "title page", or first web page of a web site.

Link: Also known as a Hyperlink. An image or text which, if clicked on, will

connect to a different web page or web site.

Log on/in: Connect to a computer network.

Search box: A place at a web site to enter search words.

Search Engine: A web site used to locate other web sites by keyword or by category.

Yahoo! And AltaVista are search engines.

URL: Uniform Resource Locator. The "address" of a web site. For example,

the address (URL) of the Chicago Tribune web site is

www.chicagotribune.com

Web page: A document of text and/or images on the World Wide Web.

Web site: A set of related web pages that form a site.

World Wide Web: A system of linked computers sharing information via web sites. One of

several parts of the Internet.
