

Early literacy is what happens *before* your child learns to read. It is broken down into six skills:

LOVING BOOKS (Print motivation):
being interested in and enjoying books.

USING BOOKS (Print awareness):
understanding that print has meaning; noticing print everywhere; knowing how to handle a book.

LEARNING WORDS (Vocabulary):
books contain a wider range of vocabulary than our spoken conversations.

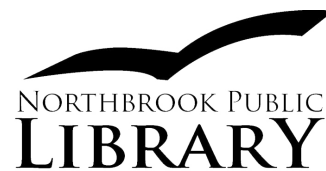
SEEING LETTERS (Letter knowledge):
knowing that letters look different from each other; knowing letter names and sounds.

HEARING SOUNDS (Phonological sensitivity): being able to hear the difference between similar sounds and play with the smaller sounds that make up words.

TELLING a STORY (Narrative skills):
being able to describe things and events, and tell stories.

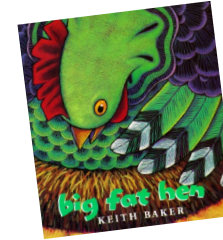

The author of the *Maisy* series bring us a young woodpecker who expertly pecks his way through a rhyming sequence of indoor objects.

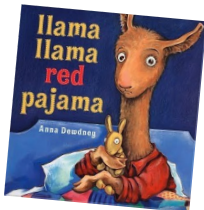
Crews, Donald

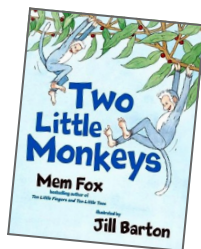
Dewdney, Anna

Eyes, Nose, Fingers, and Toes: A First Book All About You

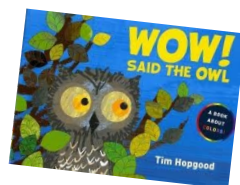
A group of toddlers demonstrate all the fun things that they can do with their eyes, ears, mouths, hands, legs and feet.

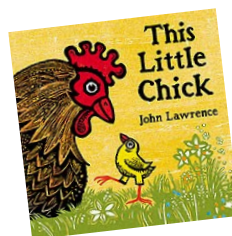
Katz, Karen

Thumpy Feet

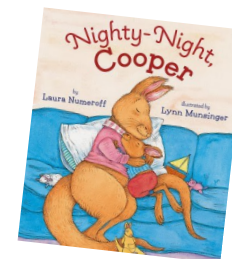
Spend a day with Thumpy Feet, a spirited orange cat.

When Mr. Horse gives a ride to his friends Cat, Dog, Pig, and Duck, they urge him to go faster and faster.

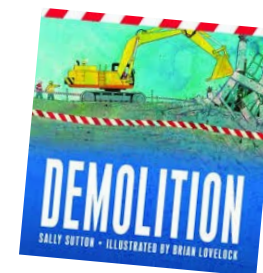
Stein, David Ezra

Rhyming text presents all kinds of dinosaurs, including ones that are sweet, grumpy, spiky, or lumpy.



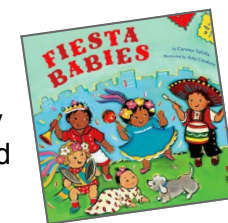
Sutton, Sally
